Great Houghton Parish Council: Chair's Report February 2024

I am sitting down to write this piece at the end of January, which is often regarded as one of the more depressing times of year but, today, although it is very cold, the sky is blue and the winter sun is shining brightly.

Survey - Traffic Calming Measures and Traffic Problems

As you will have seen from the front cover of this edition of Parish News, we are conducting a survey. We are asking residents for their views on what they would wish to see by way of traffic calming measures within the village. To be clear, we don't have power to introduce measures ourselves, but we want to clearly ascertain what residents view as the best solution so that we can advocate effectively on behalf of the village going forward. We are also asking you to confirm the traffic issues we know you encounter as we want to be able to formally document the type and extent of those problems so that we can use that data to show others (local authorities, developers etc) what happens in the village in practice. Please could I ask you to respond to the survey.

Advisory 20mph Speed Limit Signs

We are given to understand that Highways don't generally support the widespread introduction of 20mph limits. However, you may have noticed that some villages have introduced advisory 20mph speed limit signs, where the speed limit itself remains unchanged, but drivers are asked to limit their speed to 20mph. The Parish Council applied to Highways for advisory 20mph signs for Great Houghton before Christmas. Highways confirmed that they have run out of these signs, but a new batch has been ordered. We are on the list to receive signs for the village when the new batch is delivered.

Parish Council Meetings & Vacancy

The Parish Council meets on the third Tuesday of every month at 7.30pm at the Village Hall. The meeting is open to the public and there is a public participation section at the beginning of the meeting where residents can ask any questions they may have or raise any concerns. The agenda, minutes and lots of other information is available on our website at https://www.greathoughton.org.uk/ We also have one vacancy as a Parish Councillor if you would like to join the council and help take care of the village.

Hedge Laying Event – Saturday 10 February

The Parish Council's grass and maintenance contractor, Luke Costello has kindly offered to provide a free hedge laying event at the Pocket Park on Saturday 10 February from 10am, to learn how and have a go at maintaining hedgerows and so improving biodiversity.

Reverend Kris's first service

Irene's Inklings - February 2024

All go to the same place; all come from dust, and to dust shall return. Ecclesiastes 3:20

Dear Friends,

Easter comes early this year falling as it does on March 31st, preceding this we have the period of Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th, also Saint Valentine's Day. This is the day when the faithful will be marked with the sign of the cross on the forehead with ashes of the palms from previous years. The words used in this ceremony are a reminder of our mortality and also a reminder of our responsibilities in this life. "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

From Ash Wednesday, we will have forty days preparation for Easter; the Sundays of Lent are excluded as they are designated feast days on which we receive the bread and wine in church. The name Lent derives from the Anglo-Saxon word Lencten, meaning spring. However, it is not the time for rejoicing for the newest season of the year, rather, for Christians, it is a time for reflection and renewal.

Many of us start Lent with good intentions like, giving up chocolate, sugar or losing our temper, all of which are to be commended, however those actions alone, in the main, benefit only ourselves. So another element needs to be added – that of Giving as in giving away, not abstaining! But if you are giving something up, why not give something in it's stead, perhaps a donation to a favourite charity in lieu of chocolate bought or self-control exercised, for example. Christians should always look for different ways to improve the life of others less fortunate than ourselves in conjunction with improving our own spiritual health and closeness to God. This can be done by

committing to extra time spent with God on a daily basis by reading an extract from the bible, or praying a different psalm every day, or by saying the Lord's Prayer with an extra bit of thought. "Give us this day our daily bread" is fine, but why not add, "as long as there are others in need, I cannot have my daily bread with true peace of mind". Or "Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us." There is a need to recognise our own faults and ask God's forgiveness, but we also need to forgive others for wrongs done to us; we cannot just take God's forgiveness and not be prepared to offer forgiveness ourselves.

Lent is not just a period of abstinence to lose weight in readiness for our summer holidays, it is a time for renewal and fresh thought on how we can be good stewards, not only of ourselves and our faith, but of those in need and those things for which we are responsible. Our homes, our church, our village and the earth itself. We must ensure that we hand to the next generation all for which we are responsible in good order and fit for purpose.

Use Lent to review and renew your own life, contribute a little more time to good causes, if you pray, pray a little more, if you don't, Lent is a good time to start; God is always with us and always ready to listen.

May God bless you this Lent and always.


After typing in this address and pressing the return key you will see the following:-
